



SUPPORTING UNLV: PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE

Nevada State Bank has been involved in the communities we serve since our founding in 1959, and one of our longest-lasting alliances has been with the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. Over the years, we've seen its amazing growth and transformation into a world-class institution and have been proud to play a part in raising funds for many great UNLV projects. In fact, Wing Fong, who joined our board of directors in 1963, was the chief fundraiser for Judy Bayley Theatre and Artemus W. Ham Concert Hall in the late 1960s. He and his wife Lilly were passionate UNLV supporters, and Lilly Fong Geoscience Building is named after her.

I am proud to serve on the Board of Trustees for the UNLV Foundation, which was established in 1981 to coordinate all private giving for UNLV. The Foundation solicits, receives, and administers gifts and financial resources from private sources to benefit many different programs at the university.

In 2013, Nevada State Bank established a \$100,000 scholarship fund to be distributed to students of UNLV's Lee Business School who need financial aid to pursue undergraduate degrees. We are proud to play a part in helping these students reach their educational goals. They represent the next generation of business leaders, and by assisting them, we are making an investment in Nevada's future that will pay off for all of us.

The most recent development in our long-standing relationship with the university is our involvement in helping finance the \$28.5 million Fertitta Football Complex, which will become the day-to-day home of the UNLV football program. The Board of Regents asked us to assist with the financing needed to complete construction of the facility, bridging the gap between the amount raised by donors and the total needed for the project. The two-story, 73,000-square-foot facility will be a state-of-the-art headquarters to prepare our athletes for success on the field, in the classroom, and in life. This facility will benefit current players and also help Head Football Coach Tony Sanchez in recruiting future Rebels.

Our relationship with UNLV, which has lasted more than half a century, is one we are very proud of. Nevada State Bank will continue to support the university and President Len Jessup as he leads UNLV into the future.
