Volunteers at Nevada State Bank continue to support financial literacy throughout Southern Nevada

More than 70 volunteers taught nearly 600 hours from June 2016 through May 2017. In addition to local schools, organizations that have benefitted from bank volunteers include Junior Achievement of Southern Nevada, The Shade Tree, Habitual Offender Prevention and Education (HOPE) Court, Youth Offender Court and the Girl Scouts of Southern Nevada, among others.
